

## **TVAL MEMBERS MEETING**

June 16, 2022

All Members Meeting

President Linda Renaud called the meeting to order at 6:36pm. Linda announced the major topic for the meeting centers around Jill Atchison's resignation as Gallery Director effective June 30, 2022, the actions the board has already taken – identifying the three major jobs that need to be filled - and the need of volunteers from the membership to fill positions to move us forward.

A handout was distributed to the members (and will be available to our Zoom participants and others who were unable to attend the meeting in person) giving a description of the open volunteer positions that need to be filled. **WE NEED MORE MEMBER INVOLVEMENT!**

### **QUESTIONS FROM THE MEMBERSHIP DURING MEETING:**

1. Mary Landis: What are the three major positions Linda is referring to?

Response: The gallery director is number 1 with final duties in process; number 2 is still being defined and will be determined after volunteer response; number 3 is the volunteer positions and the response from you. Number 3 is critical in defining what jobs number 1 and 2 will look like. Jill commented that the open positions being passed around are the ones we need filled to get us through this year.

2. Pat Saunders-White: What if you find you cannot complete your position. Are you responsible for getting the substitute?

Response: For the short-term volunteer positions (sign up on Sign Up Genius) you are responsible for getting your substitute. For the open positions being distributed this evening, please understand the duties and timing to determine if you can fulfill the position. The Board will be sending out via email the membership list for contact information.

3. Is there a way to indicate on the membership list members who are willing or able to volunteer?

Response: All exhibiting members should be willing to volunteer. Will not be making a special designation for willingness to volunteer on the membership list. The requirements for exhibiting members to volunteer was clarified.

The meeting was paused for a couple of minutes as "Interest, Talents, and Skills" survey was passed out to attending members. The surveys were collected at the meeting. Zoom participants and others not attending the meeting in person will get the survey via email and are expected to return the survey no later than June 23<sup>rd</sup>.

During the meeting, the good news from Zoom was shared that many members were responding positively and stepping up as volunteers.

Jill reported that Art in The Park is sold out. Gail Frick is looking to add a 3D artist to her booth.

Jill gave a brief description of the Yart Sale which is June 25<sup>th</sup>.

Art and art related items (supplies) are to be delivered to the gallery at 8am June 25<sup>th</sup> (sale starts at 10am). The sale will take place inside the gallery this year with tables out front featuring art related to fundraising for Ukraine. Please don't bring miscellaneous garage sale items (old dishes, housewares.) Items must be art related – discounted art (does not have to be art you personally created), gently used and still good art supplies; art display tools. ALL ITEMS MUST BE LABELED WITH YOUR NAME AND PRICE. Artists will get the regular commission of 65% for their sold items. If you want to donate the monies from the sale of your items to the gallery, please label as TVAL with the price. Please pick up any of your items that have not sold at the end of day, June 25<sup>th</sup>. All items not sold and not claimed by the artist at the end of the day will be donated to Goodwill. You can bring in your own bins for your 2D artwork or prints.

The board presented Jill with an appreciation gift for her work in elevating our gallery to a new level.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:33pm.
